Each year, the nearly 400 members of the Philadelphia Chapter hold a Silent Auction to benefit our Knowler Fund, which subsidizes student conference and event attendance and memberships. The fund memorializes Beverly M. Knowler, a librarian at the Sun Oil Company, active member of SLA, and student advocate. The fund provides stipends for students to attend a regional conference and for one student to attend the SLA Annual Conference. Next year's conference will be in Seattle, WA.
